Individual Research Consultations

ANU Library can support you on your HDR journey. You can <u>book an individual research consultation</u> with a subject specialist librarian at a time that suits you, either online or face to face.

Ways a librarian can assist:

- help create a complex search statement using relevant keywords and subject headings and offer tips on refining the search strategy for the greatest retrieval of relevant material.
- identify relevant databases and grey literature resources in which to conduct literature searches related to your topic.
- explain how to retrieve full-text articles and use the Document Supply Service (DSS) to access hard-to-find full text articles for screening and review.
- help you use the reference management software EndNote to manage the research gathering process.
- provide information on accessing Covidence to assist with the literature inclusion/exclusion review process.
