8. NATIONAL LIBRARY OF AUSTRALIA REPORT

Ms Zobec summarised recent developments as reported by Meredith Batten to SSHLAC:

 Major electronic products including: Origins network. (no remote access at this stage). Online access to British, Irish and Scottish ancestral information, dating back to the 13th century. WorldVitalRecords.com (no remote access at this stage) – also a genealogical resource.
 Asian business and reference. Eighteenth century journals I (Adam Matthews Publications) British periodicals online collections I and II (ProQuest) Economist historical archive 1843-2003 (Gale) 19th century British Library newspapers (Gale) 17th-18th century Burney collection newspapers (Gale) Chinese People's Daily – covers issues of the newspaper from 1946 to current.

- Offsite access to electronic databases: The goal is for anybody in Australia to be able to register to gain access to selected library services and subscription electronic resources available through the NLA. Over 40 databases/resources will be available for offsite registration
- Extension of wireless access: IT section is currently working on extending the wireless service throughout the building. Users will no longer have to register, but will need to accept a declaration of use statement.
- Digitisation Projects at the NLA
 - It is anticipated that the search and delivery interface will be available to the public in 2008.
 - The National Library has received \$1 million from the Vincent Fairfax Family Foundation to support the digitisation of out-of-copyright editions of *The Sydney Morning Herald*.
 - Digitisation has been completed for the following collections:
 - Patrick White Notebooks
 - Charles Ulm national aviation collection
 - the Florenz Bleeser collection of 238 glass negatives depicting cyclone damage in Darwin in 1897
 - Eric Milton Nicholls collection featuring the work of Walter Burley Griffin and Marion Mahony Griffin
- A new version of the catalogue, *VuFind* has much better searching capabilities and a variety of additional features such as relevance-ranked searching to save you wading through pages of search results
- Pacific Projects
 - The Library has recently begun selectively archiving Asia-Pacific websites
 - The Library has also recently created an online gateway to digitised documentary materials relating to the history, culture and people of the Pacific region
 - NLA welcomes feedback on these resources
