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## 1. 'Confirmation of Candidature' replaces 'Thesis Proposal Review'

#### **Confirmation of Candidature overview:**

- formal milestone to ensure research candidates have developed a suitable research project, and will receive appropriate support;
- normally 9-12 months after start of candidature;
- requires Confirmation Review Panel (CRP), normally appointed in conjunction with First Annual Plan;
- CRP comprises all panel members + independent Chair appointed by Delegated Authority;
- applies to all candidates commencing from 1 January 2024.

#### What's new?

- Consistent University-wide requirements for both written and oral components;
- Project viability assessed by the CRP.



## 1. 'Confirmation of Candidature' replaces 'Thesis Proposal Review'

#### **Confirmation of Candidature elements:**

- written Thesis Proposal (normal expectation 5000 words) that includes: literature review, proposed methods, contribution to field, timeline & plan, skills assessment, accessibility requirements;
- 2. oral presentation (between 20-60 minutes + 10-20 minutes discussion), based on the written proposal.

#### **Assessment criteria:**

academic rigour, capability, feasibility, training needs, resources, supervision.




## 1. 'Confirmation of Candidature' replaces 'Thesis Proposal Review'

## **Confirmation of Candidature process:**

- 1. submission of Thesis Proposal at least 10 days prior to oral presentation;
- 2. meeting of candidate and CRP Chair;
- 3. meeting of CRP, without candidate, after the oral presentation;
- 4. Confirmation of Candidature meeting: CRP + candidate
- 5. CRP recommendation to the Delegated Authority: confirmation; further review (< 3 months); transfer to MPhil; withdraw/discontinue.




# Key policy & practice updates for 2024 2. Oral Examination of HDR candidates

Applies from 1 July 2024	Opt-in for current candidates; compulsory for commencing candidates.
Why?	International & Go8 standard; improve candidates' examination experience.
When?	Normally within 8 weeks of submission, and within ANU business hours.
How?	Virtual; managed by Oral Examination Chair independent of supervisory panel.
Chair	Senior ANU academic with specific training; nominated by Delegated Authority.
Who participates?	Candidate, Chair, Examiners, candidate-invited Support Person (optional).
Duration & communication of results?	Max. 2 hours; informal advice to candidate after deliberation period; formal recommendation to Delegated Authority.



3. Rights, Relationships and Respect in Research




- A new online module for HDR candidates, and HDR supervisors.
- Developed by ANU Respectful Relationships Team, in support of the University's commitment to a safe and respectful workplace.
- All HDR candidates commencing from July 2024 are expected to complete in first 3 months.
- Optional completion by HDR supervisors qualifies as a Registration Renewal Activity.
- Complements other Respectful Relationships resources and training (which also qualify as Registration Renewal Activities).
- Available from May 2024 (access details will be communicated to HDR candidates & supervisors).
